Annual expenditures include:

- Awarded \$11,000 in scholarships to police officers and their children
- Expended \$5,820.27 Association Luncheons
- Expended \$1000.00 TPCA Prayer Breakfast donation
- Expended \$250 TPCA Spouse event donation
- Expended \$2,000.00 Sponsorship Fees
- Expended \$4,600.00 Bass Tournament Awards and weigh station

As the current President of the Central Texas Area Chiefs of Police and Sheriff's Association, I ask for your help supporting our organization's efforts to provide college scholarships for police officers and their children. These scholarships are vital resources that greatly assist recipients in covering the costs of higher education.


